A Sapper is of Private rank equivalent in the Royal Australian Engineers.

A "Sap" is a deep narrow trench constructed in medieval times to approach a besieged enemy position. A "Sap" is often protected by gabions or parapets and is usually "zig zag" in alignment and protected by overhead cover as it nears an enemy position. One who "Saps" is therefore called a Sapper.

The "Sap" eventually undermines the enemy defences (such as a castle wall) using timber supports. A fire is then lit to collapse the wall to allow the Infantry access to the besieged fortification.

Modern day Sappers construct defences for our own military forces and breach the defences of the enemy: this could include landmines, improvised explosive devices, anti-tank obstacles, boobytraps and barbed wire entanglements.

Sappers also provide essential services such as: water, electricity, waste disposal, hospitals, accommodation and buildings along with roads, airfields and bridges.

The motto of the Royal Australian Engineers is: "FACIMUS ET FRANGIMUS"

Which translates from Latin "We Make and We Break!"

The Royal Australian Engineers have been awarded the Battle Honour: "UBIQUE"
