## **13 ENGINEER REGIMENT**

On 1 July 2022, Western Australia will have an increase in the number of Sappers with the formation of 13 Engineer Regiment. It will double in size with a Regimental Headquarters, the incorporation of the existing 13 Field Squadron and the formation of the new 22 Squadron.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> July, the Chief of the Army will issue an 'Order of the Day' announcing the forming of the new Engineer Regiment and the Australian Army 'Order of Battle' will be updated to include the new 13 Engineer Regiment.

For the first six months the new Regiment will be led by LTCOL Michael Hadlow (AUSTINT) and WO1 Paul Dehnert (RAINF) (Capability Implementation Team) will head up the raising and transformation of the unit and its capabilities. In January 2023 an Engineer CO and RSM will march in and take command of the Regiment.

Details of the new unit manning and equipment have not been published yet nor the details of sub-units within the Squadron.

The increase in personal will be a gradual process over a period of 3 to 5 years before the Regiment will be up to full strength. There will be a mix of ARA and ARes sappers, the majority being ARes.

Being an Engineer Regiment, they will be a stand-alone unit and although there will be no changes to the existing 13 Field Squadron, they will continue to operate in the current role but will no longer be under command of the 16 Battalion Battle Group, they will now be in-support of the 16 Battalion.

On Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> July, there will be a low-key unit parade held on the parade ground opposite the old 11/28 Battalion building. The proposed arrival time is 7.00 pm (1900 hrs) for a 7.30 pm (1930 hrs) march on time.

The Sappers will be dressed in cams and will not carry rifles. No other details of the parade are available at this time. After the parade the Ryan Club will be opened for drinks and a BBQ.

Anyone wishing to attend the parade and afterwards will have to register their names with the President RAE Association before midday 24 June 2022 so that a list of names can be submitted to 13 Fd Sqn for access into Irwin Barracks.

## ANZAC DAY

The Dawn service conducted at the RAE Memorial was very well attended with sappers from 13 Field Squadron, Association members with wives/ partners and families of deceased members and veterans in attendance.

Although numbers were down for this years march compared with previous years, it was still good to see some of the old faces again as well as a few new ones who decided to march with us this year.

Thanks to Jim Spink for providing a Transperth bus to get us to and from the march safely.

## South Australian Railways WW1 Memorial Re-dedication

In 2018, whilst carrying out research on the history of Sappers in South Australia, MAJ Patrick Trainor, former OC of 3 Field Squadron, Royal Australian Engineers, based at Warradale, found information on a substantial memorial in the Adelaide Parklands. The memorial was originally erected to those workers who were employed by SA Railways and served in the AIF in World War 1. Later World War 2 railway workers were included.

The Memorial was erected by LTCOL Stan Watson DSO MC CBE who was the Deputy Commissioner of the South Australian Railways. LTCOL Watson and several 2nd Australia Field Company sappers constructed the first pier at Anzac Cove *using a defused Turkish shell as a pile-driver, they completed the jetty on 18 June 1915; it was named 'Watson's Pier'*. There is a display and working model of the construction of Watson's Pier in the Army Museum of South Australia.

LTCOL Watson was the second last person to leave Gallipoli. He remained behind with three sergeants and 17 sappers to ensure a successful evacuation of Gallipoli.

Governor Sir Hore-Ruthven VC who, in his role as Governor of South Australia, originally unveiled the memorial on 11 October 1930.

A site inspection indicated that the memorial had been neglected with little maintenance in recent years. On this basis, MAJ Trainor took it upon himself to initiate a project to refurbish the memorial and restore it to the respectful condition for which it was designed.

Due to COVID restriction, the re-dedication of the Memorial was delayed a year and was re-dedicated on 30 October 2021.

Apart from the attendance of dignitaries and official guests, also attending the re-dedication were the surviving granddaughters of LTCOL Stan Watson. They laid a wreath during the service.

Members of 3 Field Squadron provided the Catafalque Party.
