Lionel John Metcalf





John Metcalf was born on 30th October 1920 in Northam, one of eight children. John grew up on the family farm and went to school at Koomberkine, travelling by horse and cart to school. He also attended Wesley College but found the class rooms to small for his liking and after one year returned to the farm.

With the depression hitting the farming communities hard, John soon found out he had to pull his weight helping to run the farm.

With WWII in full swing in Europe and North Africa and the Japanese marching toward Australia, John enlisted on 18th July 1942 and was assigned to 13 Field Company serving in Northern Territory and on New Britain.

John started in 2 Section until it became known that he was a farm lad and worked with machinery and was a bit of a handy man with the tools. He was transferred to the workshop section to help repair and maintain the Unit's stores.

John was demobilised in September 1945 and returned to the farm in Dowerin. In 1948 he married Mavis Whelan and they had three children, Carol, John and Dianne.

John had an unquenchable appetite for improving farm machinery and equipment to make life easier on the farm. At the age of 70 John embraced modern technology, learning to use a P.C., he connected to the net at 75, emails at 80 and facebook at 85.

John was the inaugural President of the Dowerin Machinery Field Day committee. He was a member of the Dowerin Masonic Lodge, RSL, WA National Party and the WA Farmers Federation. He was awarded life membership of the WA Farmers Federation and the Dowerin Machinery Field Day as well as a Distinguished Service medal from the National Party.

John passed away on 28th June 2015 aged 94 years 8 months. He is survived by his 3 children, 9 grand children and 16 great grand children.

Ms MacTIERNAN (Perth) (10:19): Today I want to acknowledge the talent of Perth sculptor Ron Gomboc and to record how pleased we have been to have helped him with one of his projects. Many members may recall the fabulous Swan Valley showcase that we had in June, in Parliament House, where the great produce of the Swan Valley was on display. And of course one of the people displaying their talents and their produce was Ron Gomboc. At that event Ron showed me this beautiful little statuette which had been produced for the Australian Film Institute and the Australian Academy of Cinema and Television Arts. This beautiful little object here is 22 karat gold plated and has Australian tiger iron, which is a gemstone mined in Western Australia and which really captures, along with the design, the spirit of Australia and the Australian outback.

I think it is important to understand that each of the statuettes is individually produced in order to reflect the individual talent of the recipients. Since 2011 this effectively has been the 'Australian Oscar'. It has been received by the likes of Jessica Mauboy, Cate Blanchett and Meryl Streep. Ron explained to us that he was having some small problems and misunderstandings that had emerged with the AFI over the production of the next set of these glorious objects. But I am very pleased to say that we have been able to sort these problems out, and I really want to acknowledge the helpfulness of AFI CEO Damian Trewhella in expediting this process. We have had a win all around—our Western Australian artist getting to lovingly craft his beautiful design and the brightest stars of our film industry being acknowledged with a fully authentic Australian artwork.
