Passing Parade

John Collin (Bob) Isager passed away on 13 April 2019, aged 73 years 11 months. Bob was a 16th Intake Army Apprentice Carpenter & Joiner. He served in Vietnam from October 1970 to September 1971 with 17 Const Sqn. Bob also served in PNG at Lae in the late 1970's.

Neal Harris passed away on 14 April 2019, aged 74 years 7 months. Neal was the Army Liaison Officer on HMAS Sydney when it sailed to Vietnam in September – October 1965. He also served with HQ Aust Forces Vietnam from July 1971 to February 1972.

John Bending passed away on 23 May 2019, aged 88 years 6 months. He was a West Australian, born in North Fremantle. John served in Vietnam from October 1969 to November 1970 with 1 Fd Sqn.

Names on the Life Members Honour Board

The honour board lists the names of all the Life Members of the Association and this section is to give a brief overview of the service of the first two life members.

WX5510 Spr <u>Roy William Abbott MBE</u> was born in Nedlands in 1915. He joined the Army on 26 June 1940 and assigned to the 2/2 Fd Pk Coy. In 1940, the unit deployed with the 6th Inf Div to Egypt and North Africa where they were a part of the recapture of Tobruk in January 1941.

The 6th Inf Div was the first unit selected for Greece and so in April 1941, 2/2 Fd Pk Coy landed in Greece. In late April, with the advancing German forces, the Australians were evacuated to Crete. In June, 51 members of the 2/2 were taken prisoners by the Germans, including Spr Roy Abbott.

July saw the POW's moved to Stalag XIIIC in Bavaria, Germany where they remained until the end of the war. After liberation in April 1945, the Australian POW's returned to Australia.

Spr Roy Abbott was Mentioned in Dispatches for his work in Libya in June 1941

Spr Roy Abbott was discharged in November 1945. He was an active member of the Association and given Life Membership in 1988.

WX27225 Lt <u>Hugh Maxwell Frank O'Doherty</u> was born in Perth in 1914. He joined the Army on 30 July 1942 and assigned to the 7th Australian Army Troops Company.

The 7th Army Troops Company were tasked with strengthening bridges and upgrading roads from Perth to Darwin allow for tanks to be transported north. This included the construction of a new bridge over the Moore River. They were also involved in works around Darwin.

Lt Hugh O'Doherty was discharged from the Army on 18th July 1944. He was an active member of the Association for many years and secretary from 1955 to 1977. He was given Life Membership in 1988.

WW2 Veteran Found

On ANZAC Day, while waiting for the march to start, my Presidents business card was given to Wayne Smith who had brought his father in to march with us. Colin was there to push his father's wheelchair.

A few days later I received an email from Wayne asking if I would like to visit Colin who is a resident in the RAAFA Care Centre in Bull Creek.

Last month I visited Colin Edgar Smith in the Alice Ross King building and found a 99-year-old man sitting in his chair talking to staff who left when I arrived. Over an hour later I had to leave as it was his lunch time, feeling sorry that I had not met him earlier.

For the time I was there we talked about his family moving from Victoria to Fergusons Mill near Pinjarra, his father buying farm land near Doodlakine, being called up for service in WW2 on 3 August 1941 and being allocated to RAE and 7th Army Troop Company, service in WA and Bougainville, volunteering to go to Morotai and Japan after the war and returning to the farm after being discharged on 21 February 1947.

At the age of 95, Colin left the farm to go into care at Kellerberrin and then moved into RAAFA about 2 years ago as it was more convenient for medical appointments and long-term care.
